Notice of Annual General Meeting for Society of Friends of Daysland School Council Wednesday, May 22, 2019 at approximately 8:00pm (after School Council meeting) Daysland School

What is the Society of Friends of Daysland School Council?

This Society's main purpose is to raise funds for activities and equipment to enhance student education and experience at Daysland School. This is a self-governing legal entity, which is separate from the School Board and has the authority and responsibility to make necessary decisions to manage its operations and activities. As a society, fundraising may be done that requires a gaming license from Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC), such as bingos, casinos, or raffles. (In contrast, Daysland School Council assumes an advisory role in education matters at Daysland School, such as academic programs and budgeting. It operates as part of the School and, therefore, the School Board.)

At the AGM, there will be a Special Resolution to repeal and replace the current bylaws with updated bylaws, work has been done through this year's Society of Friends of Daysland School Council membership. All parents and guardians of children at Daysland School are encouraged to become members and vote on these bylaws. Community members with a vested interest in the educational well-being of students at Daysland School may also become members. Staff of Daysland School may become Associate Members without voting rights. There is no membership fee and it simply requires a form to be filled out stating your desire to be a member. Membership forms will be available at the AGM and once filled out, membership is active.

The Gail Watt Annual Scholarship in Human Services

Sponsored by Flagstaff Family and Community Services and Flagstaff's Informsed Response Sharing Team (FIRST)

This is a \$500 scholarship presented annually to three students from each of the Flagstaff High Schools.
