Dear Parents / Guardians;

At the beginning of the year, I met with our senior high advisory group to discuss school wide activities that we could do to help develop the culture in our building. We are fortunate enough to have a variety of grades in our building and as such, we have a great opportunity to engage in cross grades activities. For example, we have paired grade groups for our Terry Fox Run and our welcome back breakfast. To build on this, we have built school squads. Each squad contains at least one staff member and 17-18 students spanning from K-12. Our goal is to build advocacy and leadership as well as increase the number of familiar faces in the building for our students. This will ultimately strengthen our caring and welcoming culture.

We wanted to have a purpose for our squads and be intentional with the planning of activities. We thought about what the end goal would be and planned activities accordingly. We decided that we would meet in our squads for a portion of the afternoon on early dismissal days and we would meet in the months of November to March.

Following is a breakdown of the activities, starting with the end goal:

March - the end goal is to have a school wide sled race. Squads will race from one end of the soccer field to the other end. All members need to cross the finish line and a minimum of three members need to be on the sled at all times (one from K-3, one from 4-6 and one from 7-9).

November - squads spent time getting to know one another through icebreaker activities. We also named our groups and created a flag. This flag will need to be attached to the sled on race day. Ask your child(ren) who their squad leader is and if they remember who is in their group.

December - squads met to plan out their design for their sled. Students were told that they are only allowed to use cardboard, duct tape and rope. Your child(ren) may have came home last week talking about supplies because we are asking our students to bring in materials for this. Ask your child(ren) about their sled design and please support them in gathering materials if have items at home and willing to donate them to the project. Students can bring these materials at any time and take them to their squad leader.

January - we will begin executing the plan and start designing the sled.

February - We will continue building our sled.

March - Race Day - it's going to be a great day.

As always, if you have any questions, please be in touch with your child's teacher or inquire at the office. We are confident that our cross graded groupings will benefit all students, regardless of age.

Daysland School Council Meeting Minutes

November 27, 2019 I. Call to order Pauline Hudson called to order the regular meeting of the Daysland School Council at 7:06pm. II. In attendance Jerrit Brandt (Principal) Wes Wilson (Vice Principal) Kirby Schmidt-Teigen Candice Guhle Pauline Hudson Laura Zwack Alison Eshpeter Heather Schmidt-Teigen Teena Kasha Cristin Zimmer Adrian Ketchmark Shaunet Petiot III. Open Floor Shout Outs Parent shout out to Miss Beaulieu for teaching students crib and golf-math skills through playing cards IV. Review of Agenda - no additions Approval of Minutes from last meeting V. Minutes from the October 23, 2019 meeting were circulated prior to meeting. Laura Zwack moved minutes adopted as circulated. Candice Guhle seconded. All in favour. Motion carried. VI. Correspondence - none VII. Reports a) SAVY -Interviewed Daysland School Grade 7-12 students about challenges facing schools in Battle River School division The main themes were: -Schools who support learning -Safe and caring environment -Reasonable class sizes (not too big, not too small) -Options and opportunities for students -Reasonable bus ride times -Idea of combining schools b) Financial – Candice Guhle At the end of November, bank balance of \$8,506.25 with \$1,810.25 in prepaid hot lunch orders. i) Still looking for grants to fund yogurt parfaits. ii) Motion: Candice Guhle moved the Financial Report be accepted as presented. Shuanet Petiot seconded. All in favour. Motion carried. c) Principal – Jerrit Brandt Shared a summary of the AERR (Annual Education Results Review). He also shared i) the draft of the 3 Year Plan. The plan is developed using multiple sources of evidence such as surveys, student and teacher voice, and achievement results, all within the scope of Daysland School. Mr. Brandt provided the opportunity for clarity, feedback and discussion. The plan will be updated to incorporate parent input. ii) Mr. Brandt met with a BRSD representative regarding transportation to sporting events, specifically student drivers. iii) Continued conversation around community and student safety when it comes to students driving around town during school hours. The school is working with police and peace officers to ensure safety of all. Vice Principal – Wes Wilson Mr. Wilson had a conversation with a BRSD dietician regarding healthy food options that may i) be offered in the breakfast program going forward. Mrs. Klein is doing an excellent job of running the program, though extra help may be considered by way of parent volunteers, work experience students or Home Ec student involvement. ii) The elementary now has three sets of Chrome Books, looking to maximize their use in the classrooms. d) Hot Lunch (Candice Guhle) We are still looking for a hot lunch coordinator. The following is a list of duties: In the spring, make a plan for hot lunch dates and what item is offered; Subway is first Wednesday of the month, Panago is last; Wednesday and Edo is the Tuesday before Subway. Fill in the rest of the Wednesday's. No hot lunch offered the week of the Christmas Buffet (last week of classes in December); Hot lunch starts up in October and goes first couple of weeks in June; Give the dates to the leader to confirm they will work for them and their team; Leaders will contact their supplier (ie Subway, Extreme Pita, Panago etc.) to confirm dates and prices; Once dates and prices are confirmed, the info can go to Adrian so that he can input everything into the online ordering program and have it ready for start of school in the fall. e) Room Reps: Kindergarten (Teena Kasha): Mrs Schmidt-Teigen- Student Portfolios went home last week to showcase each

We have introduced some STEM activities into our block play and students have enjoyed the challenge. We have been working hard on finishing up our letter sounds as well as learning numbers 0-5.

Grade 1 (Laura Zwack): Miss Mowat -They have been busy practicing their song "Up on the Housetop" for the Christmas concert. They have been after me to start playing Christmas music in the classroom already....but I told them they at least have to wait until December ;) This week was "Mission Impossible" in gym so every day high school students set up an obstacle course and students have to act like spies and try to make it through the course without

stepping on 'landmines', etc. They have really been enjoying it! This month we have also started something called 'Squads" on early dismissal days. Groups of students from grades K-12 get together and over the course of the winter they are going to design, build and race a sled. They have been asking a lot when the next meeting is! Grade 2/3 (Wendy Weiss): no report available

Grade 4 (Kirby Schmidt-Teigen): Mr. Wilson - We are busy finishing our novel study of Fantastic Mr. Fox. We are using the new Chromebooks to create a "Children's Version" of the story complete with illustrations. We hope to share them with the younger grades when we are finished. In math, we are working on multiplication and division facts. We are also joining up with the Gr. 2/3 class to do some math stations on Mondays that help us learn our number operations. In Science, we are learning lots of interesting things about Light and Shadows. We will be outside measuring shadows very soon to see how they change throughout the course of the day.

Grade 5 (Cristin Zimmer): Miss. Pederson - The Grade 5's are finished reading Holes and are completing their final projects to demonstrate their learning. Next we will be doing a book club! In math, we are in the midst of learning about our multiplication facts and memorizing them. We are starting a project in Social about the regions of Canada, Amazing Race Style. We have just finished our chemistry unit in science and will be making waffles as our final project. **Grade 6 (Adrian Ketchmark):** Mrs. McKay- The grade 6 class has an upgrade!! A couch has been donated to our room from Mrs. McKay!! The Remembrance Day ceremony went well and now we are on to the Christmas concert. Mission Impossible during Phys. Ed. has been a huge hit too. We have been working through some bullying in our class and we are happy to report that as a whole, we seem to be making better choices and continue to work and grow together.

Grade 7 (Jeanni Hoermann): Mrs. Thomas says they were wrapping up the sewing portion of their Home Ec. class last week and have been working on safety information for the last few classes. Starting next week, they will be cooking!

Dinner Theatre Update from Mrs. Thomas- Auditions and casting for our production of Willy Wonka Jr. are finished and rehearsals are set to start Thursday, November 28! We are looking forward to a great year! Also, on Thursday, November 28, we are taking members of last year's Drama class to go see a Camrose Composite High School production of "The Sound of Music". That opportunity was made possible because of donations we have received directed towards promoting arts in our building.

Grade 8/9 (Candice Guhle): Mr. Brandt - In Health 7/8 we have watched the movie Zootopia and analyzed the theme of the movie based on the actions of the characters. Our goal is to move into life learning and begin our "My Blueprint" portfolios.

Mrs. Johnson (Phys. Ed and ELA)- Basketball is starting soon! Our Jr. boys and Sr. girls head to their first tournaments this weekend. The grade 9s have started a self-chosen novel study, so students should be reading at home.

Miss Beaulieu- We are in Unit 3 in both math 8/9. I am looking for some used/donated crib boards to use with the Math 8 and 9 classes. I am wanting to teach them crib and some other strategy card games for when they finish their work early. I know we can use the computer for a virtual crib board, but it would be nice to have the actual boards, so they are practicing counting.
