Principal's Report

Time has flown by so fast that we are already looking at the end of our first Quarter for our In School and At Home Learners at Daysland School. It is important to keep informed of our schedule, particularly for our high school students. The Quarter system means fewer core courses, but it also means a very "condensed" course for high school students. The pace is much faster, assignments are due much faster, and it is critical for students to clarify any misunderstandings they have with course content right away with their teachers. Please keep in touch with your high school child to ensure they are on track with their studies and that they are keeping in close touch with their teachers if they have questions about any of their assignments. This represents a big change for students and they will need support going forward in this new system.

Grade 12 parents also need to be aware that the province recently announced that Diploma Exams will be "optional" for students in the first Quarter. We only have students registered in Math 30-1 and 30-2 and have sent a parent permission form home that these students will need you to sign to give them permission to opt out of the exam in the beginning of November. Students and parents also have the option to decide as late as the day of exams to not write the Diploma. Students who do not write the Diploma, will simply be awarded the teacher's course mark and will not be penalized if they plan on attending a post-secondary institution.

As we carry on making this year as "near normal" as possible for our students, we have organized as many events as current COVID regulations will allow. Sports teams are practicing in their cohorts, we had a "welcome back" breakfast served to students in their classrooms. Parent Council is planning a Christmas dinner for staff and students. In an unprecedented year, the more familiar things are, the more we can focus on learning.

As we look towards the second Quarter and more learning experiences for our students, we invite parent participation in the planning of our school year. As we do every year, we create a School Improvement Plan to set goals and guide us in our learning journey with our students. Battle River School Division Growing to Greatness

Many things are different in Battle River School Division this fall. Some of those changes are related to the pandemic, but others are related to the levels and kinds of services we are able to provide in support of students' specialized learning needs.

Due to a number of changes in the provincial model of how support is being offered to students, BRSD has had to make changes. The changes have included reducing the number of Educational Assistants, speech language pathologists and speech assistants, as well as the occupational and physical therapy supports we employ or contract. We will continue to be contracting support from AHS and Eastern Edge Low Incidence Team for our students with Hearing and Vision impairments.

We met with our Alberta Health Services partners several times during the month of September to learn about the changes to services they are able to provide to our students. We have also met with Eastern Edge to discuss hearing and vision supports.

Alberta Health Services will no longer be working within our schools in the same way they did before. They will occasionally come into schools to provide consultation to our staff and rehabilitation services to students who experience significant changes due to injury, surgery, illness and/or a new medical or neurological impact. AHS staff have been contacting families who previously received services or were referred to them in the spring, to let them know whether or not their child will still be receiving AHS services and how those services will be provided in the future.

To support the move to a new model, AHS has transitioned student information to us during the past two months. We are fortunate to have a good relationship with our AHS colleagues and know they are committed to working with us to make the transition as smooth as possible by sharing student goals, achievements and needs of the students they have served.

Although we are in the early stages of putting together a new model of service for our students, you need to know that our priority continues to be ensuring students get what they need in order to succeed. BRSD's Inclusive Learning team will continue to collaborate with AHS and the revamped Eastern Edge Low Incidence team to put plans in place for students. Right now, those plans are not finalized and schools are not able to answer specific questions about what services will look like for our students at this time.

We recognize that there will be an adjustment period as this model of support is developed and our service providers are given direction about the new model. School will be updated as the new service delivery model evolves and will be able to share more at that time. We appreciate your patience as we continue to work with our AHS and Eastern Edge partners.

To the parents and students of Daysland School,

Last June we missed our online auction fundraiser that The Friends of Daysland School Coundil puts on to help pay for items that make our school great. In the 2018/19 school year the auction helped with purchases such as 30 chromebooks and a cart, a water bottle filling station, crib boards for math classrooms, ukuleles, grade 1 readers, maker space supplies as well as donated some money to purchase new shop tools. This year The Friends of Daysland School Council have agreed to purchase more Chromebooks. These devices are becoming ever more important for learning in the classroom. We want enough chromebooks for a one to one chromebook to student ratio in the school.

To help cover this cost, the Friends of Daysland School Council is planning our 2nd online auction. This will be done through Facebook starting on Thursday November 26, 2020 and ending Black Friday November 27, 2020. Many of you have been involved in online auctions through Facebook before. This will be very similar to that.

You might be wondering what will be auctioned? The answers is, just about anything that is new or slightly used. We will also be auctioning off services. Perhaps you have a skid steer or garden tractor, and will offer a certain number of hours labour. Remember Christmas will be right around the corner, so keep that in mind when donating items.

Students are encouraged to participate. In our last auction we had some students who got creative. One student offered taking junk to the dump, another offered babysitting services. Maybe there are a few students that will join together as a group and offer a half day, or whole day of yard work for someone (because it is late in the fall, you might want to offer a spring clean-up).

Over the next few weeks we will be gratefully taking your donations. Then on the specified date we will start the auction. The auction will be open for 36 hours, and the last bid before "auction closed" is written (by auction administrators) will be the winner of the item.

- 6) Bidding will commence on Nov 26, 2020 at 8:00am and will close on Nov 27, 2020 at 8:00pm.
- Arrange with Kirby to pick up your item at Daysland School.

Last time we ran this fundraiser, we raised a total of \$2805! This year we anticipate another successful campaign and have set a goal to raise \$4000.


