### PowerSchool Information Elementary Percentages

When viewing the Parent Portal on PowerSchool, elementary parents will notice that a percentage is given. This is different from years past when students and parents could only see the level of achievement (Exemplary, Proficient, Achieving, etc.) Our grading system has not changed. The accurate and most important evidence of your child's learning continues to be the levels of achievement. The reason you see a percentage is that PowerSchool is an American based program and we are unable to remove the percentages from the app and website. To be completely transparent, there is nothing mathematically or educationally accurate about the percentage and it cannot be used as a reliable indicator of your child's progress. The preference would be that the percentage is not visible but despite BRSD's requests, it cannot occur at this time. We apologize for any confusion that this might cause. Please refer to the levels of achievement and follow up with any questions about your child's progress with their teacher.

## **COVID Hazard Control Administrative Procedure**

BRSD recently communicated that a new Administrative Procedure - 451 COVID Hazard Control is being implemented. This stipulates that all BRSD staff and contractors, as well as all visitors to School Buildings (including parents, coaches, trustees, outside user groups), must provide Proof of Partial Immunization by October 29, 2021, and Proof of Full Immunization no later than December 3, 2021 or negative Rapid COVID-19 Test dated 72 hours or less prior and Proof of a Negative PCR/Antigen Test. We are still open for visitors but if you do plan to visit the school by appointment, please be aware that you will have to show either of these two options prior to entering the building. A letter providing more information on how this impacts school sports will be sent home to athletes in the near future.

#### Kindergarten (Brenda): Mrs. Tanton

We're beginning to learn some dances/songs for the Christmas concert. We're making good progress with our letters, we're over half way through the alphabet. We're working on patterns, sorting and number recognition to 10 in math. We're starting our Star Student project and our Mystery Can (Show & Tell variation) started last week so the kids are all really excited about that © Lastly, I'm hoping that we can set up Santa's Workshop in the dramatic play center by the end of the month. The kids are rocking their daily classroom routines and they all seem to be very much "at home" in our classroom.

#### Grade 1 (April): Miss Pasychnyk

We have some exciting things happening in Grade 1! We have had two visits from the desk fairy now, leaving us special treats to students who have super neat desks! Students think we should send the fairy a thank-you note so it keeps coming back. We also had a TOP SECRET note left for us from our Secret Story Friend. They left behind a secret story book to help us crack the reading code with different secrets. Students are having a blast finding different secrets in our daily reading and writing tasks. Students are two stars away from filling their second reward jar and are looking forward to seeing what our next reward will be. Our learning journey continues as we tackle sentence writing, addition to 20 and a new community project in Social. The Gr.1's are soaking up each new learning outcome like sponges and have demonstrated great growth since the beginning of the year!

#### Grade 2 (Kirby): Mrs. Schlaut

Grade 2s have been working really hard to represent numbers to 100. We are learning new numeracy games to practice this skill using a deck of cards and a place value mat. We are working on comparing

numbers the numbers to determine which one is greater. In Language Arts, we are learning about syllables and how to decode new words using our phonemic knowledge. We are also learning how to write a paragraph. We will begin writing a paragraph about a special friend in our class. Students are looking forward to getting started on these. We have been learning about Remembrance Day and why it is important to take the time to be thankful and think about everyone who has made sacrifices for us. We will begin our Remembrance Day posters for the Legion contest this week. We are also taking a journey to Iqaluit. We are learning about the community and about the Inuit culture. We have taken a look at some artifacts that were made and used by people of the Inuit culture as well as learning what the land and climate is like there. We are just about finished our science unit on Liquids and will begin our new unit Magnets next week. In phys-ed, we just finished Mission Impossible and it was awesome! We will begin skipping this week.

#### Grade 3 (Heather): Mrs. Teigen

Things are going well in grade 3. We began a new unit in Science called "Testing Materials and Design". We are excited to make use of the Maker Space for this unit. In Social Studies we have begun talking about the Traditions and Celebrations of the 4 countries we are learning about. We will end this section just before Christmas presenting to the class a special tradition that each of us has in our own families. In ELA we are beginning a novel study called, "Freckle Juice." Mr. Pastachuk is taking over our art classes this quarter and we have already begun preparing for the virtual Christmas Concert with Mrs. Tanton!

#### Grade 4/5 (Alison): - Mr. Gratrix

The Grade 4-5 class had a nice wrap up to the previous term. In ELA we finished with some group guided reading and descriptive writing. Math has been busy, but both classes are almost finished with the units we have been working on. Grade 4 has been adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers and the Grade 5 class has been multiplying 2 digit numbers. In Social we have finished our unit on the physical regions of Canada, and will start looking at the history of Canada soon. The weather unit in Science is complete and we are moving to electricity now.

#### Grade 6 (Wendy): Mrs. McKay

In ELA, we have wrapped up our novel study on The Breadwinner and have been working on writing Remembrance Day poems to submit for the Legion contest.

In Math, we just wrote a unit exam on Understanding Number, and are starting our next unit on Fractions, Ratios, and Percents.

In Science, we've been researching different trees found in our area, and examining tree cookies to determine important events in a tree's life. We will soon be moving on to our next unit: Sky Science!

We will also be spending a lot of time on the Christmas concert. Everyone is very excited to brush up on our acting skills, as grade 6 gets the privilege of being the stars of the show!

#### Grade 7 (Cristin): Mrs. V. Zimmer

Moving into a new quarter today means a couple of minor changes for the class, but their core teachers don't change throughout the year. These students have been embracing the idea of respectful behaviour in the classroom so much that we are working out a rewards system together!

#### Grade 8 (Adrian):

Q2 has started today for the grade 8's. Our 4 core subjects are still going with only one teacher change, LA Mr. Pastachak is now teaching us Narrative Perspectives. Math with Mrs. Zimmer is changing fractions into decimals. A new option class has started in Q2, Film Studies. This class appears well attended. In Phys. Ed. we have started our basketball unit.

#### Grade 9 (Jeannie): all is well
